4c <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Interest> The difference between simple and compound interest is that compound interest earns interest on the interest previously earned....over time (many years) it becomes a big number... Compared to simple interest which only earns interest on the original amount (not the original amount plus the interest already earned.)

Req 6: The merit badge book chapter “Saving Versus Investing” gives a pretty good overview of these concepts. Basic difference between saving and investment: In saving you are putting money away for something in the future (car, education, emergency etc...) An investment is to make more money (ex. To buy a lawn mower for lawn mowing jobs to make money....more than you would if you just saved it in the bank, Some investments can be more risky....can lose it all (your lawn mower destroys itself, you do a crappy job mowing lawns so no one calls you back, someone steals your lawn mower it.)

Req 8: This is a 7 day time management exercise. If you haven’t done it start it now....only takes a week. Keep a careful journal of your time and then put it into your worksheets. Find out what you waste your time doing every day for one week.

Req 9: Develop a project plan. Make sure to write up all 5 parts of your project. This is only a pretend project but you should go through the planning just like it is.planning a family vacation, camping trip, some kind of service project for a homeless shelter etc. Ask your parents for ideas if you come up blank..... (maybe an Amtrak Train trip to Glacier Nat’l park....find out where you can order tickets online through their website....where would you get the train from in Wisconsin, who will take care of your pet gold fish, where would you stay in Glacier (rent a car, tent, lodge etc...google search out possibilities etc, how much do you budget for all this....where will the money come from? Make part of req #1 ??)

Req 10....easiest requirement but document your work in your worksheets your research in part b. Ex: You want to become a brain surgeon....search the web to find out what you will have to do to achieve that goal....what school will you have to go to, what kind of GPA you going to have to have to get in that school. What high school courses are you going to have to take to get in that school. How long will it

take and how much might it cost you before they let you hold a scalpel in your hand? Do you know a brain surgeon or just an old real doctor....what did he have to do to get where he or she is.
